Course Overview	From the economy to the environment and from politics to entertainment, creativity is an endlessly renewable resource that offers benefits for all citizens and may well be the most important human element for our future. Students from all disciplines can investigate the practices and processes of creativity and explore the ways in which it can help enrich their lives.

Course Description	Creativity is not exclusive to musicians, performers or artists. Many people incorrectly think that they lack creativity and that it is an ability that cannot be learned. This course is designed to demonstrate that creativity exists in everyone in a multiplicity of ways. It is a skill that can be learned and incorporated into every discipline, decision, and aspect of one's life to generate opportunities and possibilities. Every word, object, and action is an occasion for creative ingenuity. This course will investigate and consider the ways to encourage and foster creativity, as well as means that creativity is thwarted.
