McGraw-Hill Publisher. 5th or 6th Edition also acceptable.</p> <p><i>A Streetcar Named Desire</i> by Tennessee Williams. This script is in the <i>Norton Anthology of Drama</i>, a DRAM 240 required text. Or you can find a copy in used bookstores or order it online.</p>

Course Description	An introduction to performance design and the disciplines within it: scenery, props, lighting, costumes and sound. Includes a study of the history of theatre design and space. Topics regarding contemporary notions of scenography will be explored, for example performance art, ritual, etc.
Course Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To introduce students to scenography and it's role in the world of theatre. • To give students the opportunity to execute a paper-project related to a play and its visual and aural world. • To prepare students for future classes in scenography and theatre production by teaching the pertinent vocabulary required for working in technical theatre or for theatre production.
Course Activities and Content	<p>Lecture & Studio: Topics include historical and contemporary performance spaces, methods of communication for scenographers to directors and technicians, and topics relating to contemporary scenography questions.</p> <p>Research and Presentation Students will research an assigned scenographer and give a Pecha Kucha style presentation to the class. (10 minutes 20 slides)</p> <p>Scenography Assignment (Projects 1& 2): Students will have the opportunity to explore a play and its visual and aural world. They will explore techniques of model, drawing, collage, multi-media, sound creation and installation. An innovative approach will be encouraged.</p> <p>Materials & Equipment: -Pencils: 2H, HB, 2B and a sharpening device -8.5" x 11" All-Purpose Sketchbook -Black foamboard -Carpenter's glue -Steel ruler with cork backing -Matte knife Other materials may be required for some exercises but do not buy these until needed. Most materials are available from the Campus Bookstore.</p>

Assessment	<p>Pecha Kucha Presentation – 20% Students will research an artist, theatre company or group of artists that practice or have practiced as scenographers and will present their research to the class in a Pecha Kucha style; 10 slides in 10 minutes.</p> <p>Exam – 30% Of material covered in lectures and readings.</p> <p>Project #1 – 15% Costume Plot, Props List, Scene Breakdown and Design Concept with research for <i>A Streetcar Named Desire</i></p> <p>Project #2 – 35% Set and Costume Design for <i>A Streetcar Named Desire</i></p> <p>Bonus Assignment – 5% Attend a professional production or a Drama Mainstage performance and submit a 3-4 page review of the scenography using the vocabulary from the lectures and readings. Each student may submit up to 2 (two) Bonus Projects.</p> <p>Please Note:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the fine arts, skills are cumulative. Each project adds to the understanding of the organizational processes and skills needed to complete subsequent projects. It is necessary that you participate in, and finish all the projects to be successful in this course. • Similarly, all the parts of a project, exercise or sketchbook assignment contribute to the evolution and final realization of the work. Therefore, the Instructor(s) may decide not to accept or grade incomplete projects; all parts of each project must be included in the final submission by the given deadline. • Class exercises, sketchbooks, and projects will be given a letter grade or a grade out of 100 and will be due as noted in the schedule or as specified by the instructor.
