In reference to Process: The instructor will guide the class through a series of exercises in order to arrive at a design. The students will be graded on their openness to embrace the unknown, their depth of inquiry into the subject matter, and their creativity. When grading the instructor will take into account student growth from one project to the next. Throughout all projects students are encouraged to discover their own individual needs as artists and are equally encouraged to find their own ways of meeting those needs. Grading will also consider the range of research and depth of thought undertaken by the student in the context of the project.

Course Critiques and Grades: This course includes class critiques in which student works and performance are discussed and critical analysis offered by the instructor and students. Formal grades for student work will be conveyed privately and not in class discussion.
