Assessment components

<u>Class Participation</u>:

Weight: 15%

Description: Participation in class play readings and discussions.

Assignment 1:

Assessment Method: Essay

Weight: 20%

Due Date: November 15

Description: Students will formulate a research question for a play of their choice

and write a 1000-word research paper.

Assignment 2:

Assessment Method: Performance Response

Weight: 10%

Due Dates: October 27 for *Hookman*, December 1 for *Much Ado About Nothing* Description: Students must attend the SCPA performances of *Hookman* and *Much Ado About Nothing* and respond to an essay prompt in response to **one** of the performances. The due date is dependent on which play students chose.

Quizzes

Weight: Three quizzes worth 20% each for the first two, and 15% for the last.

Dates: October 6, November 3, December 6

Description: In class, multiple choice and short answer questions. Not cumulative.

Guidelines for Submitting Assignments:

Any assignments requiring submission will be submitted in class.

Missed or Late Assignments:

Missed assignments and quizzes will be awarded a 0.

Students are encouraged to reach out before the due date in order to discuss options if they will not be able to make the due date. No penalties will be awarded for valid reasons as long as the student communicates with me prior. However, if nothing is communicated, assignments submitted after the due date may be penalized with the loss of a third of a grade (eg., A- to B+) for each day late.
