Please hold 3 sectionals in October and 4 in November. Beyond learning notes and spending time together, work to unify your sectional sound. 5. A primary goal for the year is to memorize our music. We hope to visit high schools this year as well as tour and singing for memory is impressive. Singing for memory also maximizes your enjoyment of the notes that you have worked hard to learn. 6. Pumpkin carving and a social event is planned for late October.
