COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES	A continuing study of part-writing and analysis with an emphasis on chromatic harmony and modulation in the music of the 18 th and 19 th centuries. Musical applications of computers will also be included (notation, composition). Analysis of representative compositions will be undertaken to illustrate chromatic harmony in context and common formal designs of common practice literature will be explored. The objective of the course is to acquire and develop skills in writing and analysis of chromatic harmony.										
COURSE ACTIVITIES	Lectures involving audition and analysis of representative works of the 18 th and 19 th centuries; weekly part-writing exercises; two computer notation exercises; final composition project and in-class performance.										
COURSE CONTENT	Study of harmonic vocabulary, voice-leading and formal procedures of 18 th and 19 th century western classical music.
