All submitted compositions must be copied, photocopied and bound according to professional standards. One piece is to be notated by hand and the other piece is to be notated using NotabilityPro, including parts.

No final exam. Assignments handed in late by 1-7 days will lose a grade. Assignments will not be accepted if more than 1 week late without valid reason.
