| COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES | This course will examine the effect of African slaves and their music on the creation of North American music and the subsequent reverse effect on African music. The introduction of African slaves to this continent led directly to the creation of: Work songs and field hollers Spirituals Gospel music Country and Urban Blues Ragtime and Early Jazz Jazz Rhythm and Blues Soul Funk Latin Music/Afro-Latin Music/Salsa Music Other Later, the reverse trend occurred — North American music impacted on African styles resulting in the streams of Juju, Afrobeat, and High Life African musics among others. To examine the above styles, it will learn to recognize (by ear) the various instruments in play, to build a knowledge and understanding of the twelve-bar blues, and will learn to recognize artists and songs (by ear) in the above styles. |
