Creation and performance of multi-channel acousmatic, interactive and network compositions with an emphasis on using new interfaces and programming in Max and developing engaging musical/sonic works.

The course comprises:

- advanced studio and computer techniques
- weekly creative work and research
- survey of repertoire and software

Topics to be studied in the realization of the creative projects:

- mapping performance gesture to sound
- techniques of sound synthesis, processing, sampling, sound spatialization
- network music performance and techniques
- user-interface and instrument design in Max, Mira, TouchOSC and Lemur
- studio composition with LogicPro; spatialization with LogicPro Remote
- survey of other audio programming software such as: SoundHack, SuperCollider, Control, JunctionBox for Android, ianniX, Unity, Faust
- exploring the potential of *Phidgets* (USB Sensing and Control transducers) in music interfaces
- programming and communication with OSC
- programming and use of iPad and/or Android touch surface devices
