Prerequisites:	MUTC 221A. This course is a prerequisite for Musicianship II (MUTC 321).																							
Course Description Course Objectives	This course is the first in a 2-year sequence in musicianship taken by most music majors at the U of C. This sequence of courses is designed to help the student musician who intends to make music a career by developing skills in rhythm, intonation, sight-singing, and melodic/harmonic dictation. Certain portions of this course's material will probably be familiar to you, but a solid grounding of fundamentals will be very useful to you later on in this and other courses.																							
Attendance	This course focuses on skills that are learned through active participation in class activities. As such, your regular attendance is essential to your satisfactory completion of the course, and your participation in class is tied to your final grade (see below). If you get sick or go on an ensemble tour, we will do our best to help you catch up, but we cannot recreate the class meetings you missed. If you choose to skip class, you will be on your own to catch up. Failure to appear for a scheduled Quiz or Skills Test will result in points deducted from your mark on these assignments unless prior permission is granted (or you can provide a note from a Doctor or other relevant individual).
