**GERMAN TEXTS IN TRANSLATION**

**GENDER AND WAR:** This course asks questions of some representative texts, films, and art work depicting German experiences of war in the twentieth century: What strategies do governments mobilize to convince their citizens that war is necessary? Who are the heroes and what must be sacrificed for the cause of war? What means of resistance do citizens employ against militaristic regimes and in what way are those means gendered? In the immediate aftermath of war, how do men and women come to terms (or not) with their wartime experiences?
