## DESCRIPTION

This course will give students an opportunity to approach global humanities in a manner that shows the relationship between the culture of the past and life in the present. This course will examine the arts and ideas of the West in relation to those of other world cultures, including India, East Asia, Africa, and Native America, with a special focus on French, Italian and Spanish landscapes in Literature and Film. Students will learn about European literature, film, art history and geography, with a particular attention to the different Mediterranean cultures and cityscapes

Objectives: The purpose of this course is to introduce undergraduate students to French, Italian and Spanish literature, film, art history, culture and society (food and fashion included), through the variety of Mediterranean's landscapes and cityscapes, as portrayed by major poets, painters, novelists and directors. Three written assignments and two exams will provide an occasion for testing students' work in progress. Final paper should be envisaged and organized as the journey students would finally like to experience: through their readings and their favorite Italian, French and Spanish sites, cities and landscapes.

The topic will be agreed with the instructor. The paper will have a length of $5 / 8$ pages, in English. There will be no final exam.
